Processes that help patients move toward emotional healing and modification of thought and behavior are used, such as facilitating improved interpersonal exchanges, group support, and reminiscing. The group may be composed of patients with separate and distinct <u>maladaptive disorders or persons sharing some facet of a disorder.</u>	This code should be used for group psychotherapy with other patients, and not members of the patients' families.
90863	Pharmacologic management, including prescription and review of medication, when performed with psychotherapy services (List separately in addition to the code for primary procedure)	The patient's medications are managed during a psychiatric service, including the patient's current use of medicines, a medical review of the benefits and treatment progression, management of side effects, and review or change of prescription. This is a pharmacologically related service and is reported in addition to non-crisis related psychotherapy when there is no other evaluation and management service performed during the encounter. 92508	Speech therapy group	The patient undergoes developmental programs such as speech therapy, sign language, or lip reading instruction or hearing rehabilitation. In auditory processing disorders, the patient (usually a child) cannot process the information heard due to lack of integration between the ears and the brain, even though hearing may be normal. Central auditory processing disorder (CAPD) is often confused with or functions as an underlying factor to a number of learning disabilities. The treatment program is for the individual in 92507 or <b>in a group</b>	
92526	Treatment of swallowing dysfunction and/or oral function for feeding aimed at finding the specific cause of the dysfunction to treat the problem, such as (improve esophageal motility).		
92606	Therapeutic service(s) for the use of non-speech-generating device, including programming and modification	Services differ according to the device used. Electronic equipment may require routine maintenance, programming, and mounting systems. Other equipment may require customization (e.g., symbol boards). Non-speech generating devices may require some patient therapeutic, rehabilitation, or occupational training.	

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92607	Evaluation for prescription for speech-generating augmentative and alternative communication device, face-to-face with the patient; first hour	The patient is evaluated face to face by a specialist to determine the motor skills, hearing, cognitive abilities, comprehension, natural speech, esophageal and pharyngeal air flow, general health, and patient motivation for prescription of speech-generating augmentative and alternative communication (AAC) device. Once these are evaluated, an appropriate speech-generating device is prescribed.	Report 92607 for the first hour and 92608 for each additional 30 minutes.

92609	Therapeutic services for the use of speech-generating device, including programming and modification	Services differ according to the device used. 92610	Evaluation of oral and pharyngeal swallowing function	The patient is evaluated to determine the oral and pharyngeal swallowing function. Assessment of the oral cavity includes the size, position, resting tone, range of motion and development of the tongue, lips, and palate. Palpation of the thyroid notch or cricoid arch with swallowing is used to determine elevation of the pharynx. Using a curved probe, sensation of the oral cavity may be assessed. An inventory of cranial nerves must also be included.

This code is reported for one-on-one patient contact time, per 15 minutes, and includes the preparation of a written report.
97760	Orthotic(s) management and training (including assessment and fitting when not otherwise reported), upper extremity(s), lower extremity(s) and/or trunk, each 15	The health care provider fits and/or trains the patient in the use of an orthotic device for one or more body parts. This includes assessment as to type of orthotic when appropriate. This does not include fabrication time, if appropriate, or cost of materials.	
97762	Checkout for orthotic/prosthetic use, established patient, each 15 minutes	The health care provider evaluates the effectiveness of an existing orthotic or prosthetic device and makes recommendations for changes, as appropriate.	
G9005	Coordinated care risk adjusted maintenance	Used for billing SBHS services listed on IEP or IFSP provided by licensed therapists within the scope of practice for coordinating	
G9007	Coordinated care fee, scheduled team conference	IEP/IFSP practitioners medical portion only of the conference within medical expertise/license for services within the scope of practice	
G9012	Coordinated care, other specified care management	Is for a separate medical condition not currently addressed on the IEP/IFSP, that may or may not require more time added to the IEP/IFSP And results in an updated treatment plan, an increase in supervision, monitoring, and training DHC staff to perform new nursing tasks related to the change in condition. eg; child with seizure disorder that develops diabetes.

The child's needs are identified in an evaluation process. Specific instructions are provided to teachers and related providers so that there is a clear understanding of the disability and its effect on the learning process.	<b>While there are some eligibility differences between Early Intervention (EI) and Early Childhood Special Education (ECSE) services, Oregon has a single seamless system delivery model for children age birth to kindergarten. EI/ECSE services are provided pursuant to an IFSP that meets both Part B of IDEA IEP requirements and Part C of IDEA IFSP requirements. Oregon Department of Education (ODE)'s documentation for IDEA Part B services pursuant to an IEP and an IFSP combined Part B and Part C services, were approved by the federal Office of Special Education Programs (OSEP). The IEP and IFSP documented services required by IDEA are used as the prescriptive documents for leveraging Medicaid under School Based Health Services (SBHS). There may also be sensory loss, behavioral problems, or social issues. The characteristics and severity of these disabilities vary. Severe multiple disabilities include cerebral palsy, severe autism, and brain injuries. An integrated specialty team consisting of practitioners from appropriate practices evaluates the individual with the multiple handicaps and determines which services would be necessary to provide care for the
